

# Ramovic just wants attention, retorts Mokwena

'Give him the praise, please'

Mamelodi Sundowns coach Rulani Mokwena has described his counterpart at TS Galaxy, Sead

Ramovic, as an attention seeker and has asked the media to give it to him.

Mokwena was responding to claims made by Ramovic last Thursday in the Nedbank Cup press conference where he claimed the Sundowns coach used the F-word during their telephonic call.

Speaking to the media after his side beat AmaZulu 3-0 in the DStv Premiership match to maintain their lead at the top of the table, Mokwena said he will not be involved in this argument again.

"If I have to say something to Sead, again, I will pick up the phone and I will say it on the phone," Mokwena said.

"I don't think that it is for the public because we go into a space that we are not supposed to go to.

"I don't mind if he comes for me. There are a lot of coaches who have come for me.

"You see, when

you start to say the club has spent so much money, you are also disrespecting the Motsepe family, who give so much of their hard-earned money into football and many other things.

"You [media] must give him all he is crying for. I don't know why you can't hear the underlying message.

"All he is crying for; he's won five games in a row. Give him attention, give him praise, give it to him."

Sundowns and Galaxy will meet next Wednesday in the league match in Mbombela and Mokwena said he will shake his hand if Ramovic wants it.

## PUBLIC NOTICE Trial release of Genetically Modified Maize

This is to inform the public that authorization has been requested by Syngenta South Africa (Pty) Ltd (Private Bag X60, Halfway House, 1685; [www.syngenta.com](http://www.syngenta.com)) for intentional trial release approvals of Bt11 x MIR162 x MON 89034 x NK603 and Bt11 x MIR162 x NK603 maize in South Africa during the 2024 to 2026 growth seasons.

Upon receiving official authorisation, these trials will be performed in the provinces of Free State, Mpumalanga, Northern Cape, and KwaZulu Natal. These field trials are part of a larger programme evaluating the efficacy and performance of insect resistant and herbicide tolerant maize under South African conditions. The trial sites to be used are located in established agricultural field. The trials will be planted with a time and/or spatial isolation to any other maize near the trial site. Plant material needed for analysis or subsequent trial releases will be stored at a Syngenta registered facility. All other plant material will be destroyed at the end of the trials. The trial sites will be monitored for one season after termination of the trials to detect any possible volunteers. Additionally, all the permit conditions as prescribed by the Executive Council will be followed. The trials will consist of Bt11 x MIR162 x MON 89034 x NK603 and Bt11 x MIR162 x NK603 maize that will be compared to general released and non-transgenic control maize.

The stacked-event maize products, Bt11 x MIR162 x MON 89034 x NK603 and Bt11 x MIR162 x NK603 were developed by using conventional breeding techniques that combine the individual Bt11, MIR162, MON 89034 and NK603 transformation events. No vector was used for the production of the Bt11 x MIR162 x MON 89034 x NK603 and Bt11 x MIR162 x NK603 maize and no further genetic modification has taken place.

The transgenes in Bt11 x MIR162 x MON 89034 x NK603 and Bt11 x MIR162 x NK603 maize are not different from those of the individual Bt11, MIR162, MON 89034, and NK603 maize. Bt11 x MIR162 x MON 89034 x NK603 and Bt11 x MIR162 x NK603 maize have stably inherited:

- o the *cry1Ab* and *pat* transgenes from Bt11 maize
- o the *vip3Aa20* and *pmi* transgenes from MIR162 maize
- o the *cry1A.105* and *cry2Ab2* transgenes from MON 89034 maize
- o the *cp4 epsps* transgenes from NK603 maize

The Bt11 x MIR162 x MON 89034 x NK603 and Bt11 x MIR162 x NK603 maize express the following proteins, as expressed in the individual Bt11, MIR162, MON 89034, and NK603 maize:

- o the Cry1Ab, Vip3Aa20, Cry1A.105 and Cry2Ab2 proteins for control of certain maize lepidopteran pests
- o the PMI protein, that allows transformed maize cells to utilize mannose as the primary carbon source while maize cells lacking this protein fail to grow
- o the PAT protein that confers tolerance to herbicide products containing glufosinate ammonium
- o the CP4 EPSPS protein that confers tolerance to herbicide products containing glyphosate

The source of the *cry1Ab*, *vip3Aa20*, *cry1A.105* and *cry2Ab2* transgenes is *Bacillus thuringiensis*. The source of the *pat* transgene is the aerobic bacterium *Streptomyces viridochromogenes* strain Tu494. The source of the *pmi* transgene is the common bacterium *Escherichia coli*, K-12 strain. The source of the *cp4 epsps* transgene is the common soil bacterium *Agrobacterium* sp. strain CP4. All these gene sources have a long history of safe use.

### NOTICE OF REQUEST FOR PUBLIC COMMENTS ON THE DRAFT CLOSED CIRCUIT TELEVISION (CCTV) BY-LAW OF CITY OF JOHANNESBURG METROPOLITAN MUNICIPALITY

Notice is hereby given in terms of section 7(1) of the Rationalization of Local Government Affairs Act, 10 of 1998, that the City of Johannesburg Metropolitan Municipality declares its intention to create the Closed-Circuit Television (CCTV) By-Law.

The aim of this By-Law is to provide for regulation and registration of Privately-Owned Closed-Circuit Television Surveillance Camera ("CCTV Camera") in Public Spaces and Private Property with the view to Public Spaces within the City, while promoting the use of CCTV Camera, as a mechanism to deter crime and to prosecute perpetrators of crime and to ensure safety and security of individuals and property within the City.

**The proposed by-law can apply in the following:**

- Applies to private and external CCTV cameras installed on the City of Johannesburg land and infrastructure as well as private CCTV cameras installed on Private Property, monitoring the City's public area and those CCTV cameras which forms part of a broader CCTV network.
- This by-law is intended to regulate and not restrict the erecting of CCTV infrastructure on City structures.
- This by-law is only applicable within the boundaries of the City of Johannesburg.
- This policy has transversal implications, as it affects the various departments responsible for the structures, where CCTV systems will be installed.
- The application, registration, installation and public participation processes.
- The City of Johannesburg departments are not required to follow the application process, but merely register the locations of the CCTV cameras with the Johannesburg Metropolitan Police Department for documentation and database recording purposes using an internal organizational template.
- Enforcement of offences and penalties.
- Access to camera footage and information disclosure processes.

The proposed by-law is applicable to use for camera related surveillance equipment including:

- Automatic Number Plate Recognition (ANPR).
- Body Worn Video (BWV).
- Unmanned Aerial Systems (UAS); and
- Other systems that capture information of identifiable individuals or information relating to individuals.

The Public and interested and affected organisations have 30 days commenting period ending by close of business on Wednesday 03 April 2024.
